

Year 1 Autumn Term Topic 2: The Great Fire of London

In Year 1, our topic this half term is The Great Fire of London. We will be learning about this topic for 7 weeks. Please choose *at least one* of the following ideas, to complete at home alongside any reading and phonics work you are currently doing. At the end of the topic, your homework and models will be displayed within school.

Draw a picture of a street scene to show what life was like in London in 1666 before the Great Fire. Show what the buildings looked like and what the people wore and might be doing.

Make a shop sign for the bakery on Pudding Lane.



Get together with everyone within your household and create a fire escape plan. Check the smoke alarms in your homes work and contact the local fire service if you need an alarm fitting.

Samuel Pepys buried his parmesan cheese and wine to protect it from the fire. Write a list of 5 things you would bury.

Design and make a model of your own bakery or a building from 1666.



The Great Fire of London started in a bakery on Pudding Lane. Have a go at baking something you could sell in a bakery. Take a picture of the final product to show us!

Samuel Pepys kept a diary of events during The Great Fire of London. Keep your own diary for a weekend and write about all the things you do.
