Why do Christians perform Nativities at Christmas?

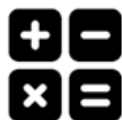
Religions and world views: Christians, Hindus, Judaism.

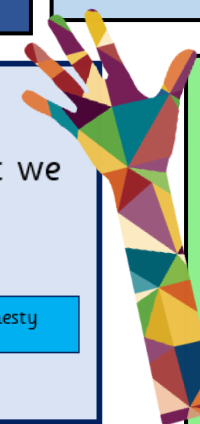
